



Chapel Hill, NC (DATE 20XX) - The American Board of Pediatrics (ABP) is pleased to announce that **<physician name, MD,>** has completed all requirements to maintain **<his/her>** certification in **<general pediatrics/subspecialty>** and has re-enrolled in another five-year Maintenance of Certification (MOC) cycle.

Board certification signifies that pediatricians have gone above and beyond state licensing requirements to practice medicine. To become certified by the ABP, physicians must satisfactorily complete **<three for GP; six for subspecialty>** years of training in an accredited pediatric residency program and pass a rigorous examination. Once they earn certification, they are enrolled in the board's Maintenance of Certification (MOC) program to ensure that they are continually improving their skills and knowledge.

During each five-year cycle, certified pediatricians earn credit for activities that enhance their knowledge of medical advances and engage them in “best practices” for patient safety and quality care. Every 10 years, they also must pass an examination of medical knowledge and problem-solving abilities.
